Unseen Halos

“Just then, a man in their synagogue who was possessed by an evil spirit cried out, ‘What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are – the Holy One of God!’” Mark 1:24

The church celebrates “All Saints Day” on November 1. A saint is “a holy person.” In the Apostle’s Creed, we describe the holy Christian church as “the communion of saints” – or the body of all believers. Rev. John Kleinig, of the Lutheran Church of Australia, has these thoughts concerning saints (the following excerpt is from his book, “Grace Upon Grace, Spirituality for Today,” available from CPH):

“When my wife and I were in England, we got to know a single American woman named Ruth. She was a visiting member of our congregation in Cambridge, a devout woman of prayer with a deep, unobtrusive faith. If you passed her in the street, you would most likely not have noticed her because she had reached the stage in life where she, like many other ordinary middle-aged women, had become socially invisible. Yet once we got to know her, we discovered that she was a remarkable person with a deep inner radiance.

She told us about something that had happened when she was traveling on a tour through India. Her guide was a handsome young Indian Hindu who used every opportunity to tell them all about his religion. Most of the tourists were fascinated by him and by what he had to say about Hinduism. One day, as they were going along a long stretch from one place of interest to another, he offered to tell the fortunes of the people on the bus. No one objected. So he went down the aisle from person to person, asking the date of their birth and reading the palms of their hands. They did not quite know what to make of it, but were obviously fascinated by what he told them about themselves and what lay in store for them. When he came to Ruth, he simply passed her by. Some days later, when Ruth was

alone with him, she asked him why he had overlooked her. He said, "You're a Christian, aren't you? I can't see you and your future." She was astonished by his remark because she had not said anything or had not even worn a cross that could have identified her as a Christian. But she had been praying for the protection of the people who were having their fortunes told. She did not know that the guide could sense what she herself could never see: she was covered with Christ and His holiness.

We, too, are covered with Christ and His holiness. But we cannot see that any more than we can see our own faces unless we look at ourselves in a mirror. Our righteousness and holiness is hidden from us, just as Christ is hidden in our mortal bodies. Yet Satan, and all those who are on the dark side, can sense our holiness, just as they recognized the divinity of Jesus long before any of His disciples did. Those on the dark side see what we can't see. They see that we are in the light and that the light of Christ is in us. So even though we are mostly unaware of our status, we are protected, enlivened, and kept holy by Him. We are all living saints, holy people. We are "*christophers*"- Christ bearers – for Christ is in us just as we are in Christ. We have halos, but we can't see them. When Christ appears, then we too will appear with Him in His glory, halos and all. When we see Him as He is, we will see ourselves for the first time, as radiant and splendid and spotless as we are already now in Him. Till then, we walk by faith and not by sight, together with Christ on our daily journey from earth to heaven."

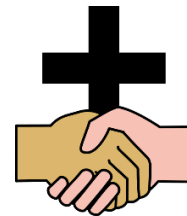
Tape Ministry
