**From the Pastor**

Greetings in the name of the Lord!

Last month, I took some time and gave you a brief introduction to my family. This month, I would like to shed some light on “the method behind my madness,” specifically in regards to sermons. Spoiler alert for confirmation-aged members: this will be helpful as one of your tasks in Confirmation class is sermon notes (learning how to listen to sermons and pick-out main points).

In his explanation to the Sixth Petition of the Lord’s Prayer, Martin Luther writes, “God tempts no one. We pray in this petition that God would guard and keep us so that the devil, the world, and our sinful nature may not deceive us or mislead us into false belief, despair, and other great shame and vice. Although we are attacked by these things, we pray that we may finally overcome them and win the victory.”

Notice that Martin Luther calls out by name the three enemies of a Christian: the devil, the world, and our sinful nature. And this specifically is what I want you to remember when listening to a sermon. Sometimes, you may be listening and think, “Wow, there isn’t much Gospel in this sermon.” Or, the opposite, “Wow, there really isn’t much Law mentioned at all.”

If and when these thoughts cross your mind, run this simple test – what enemy is being confronted in the sermon (text)? Sometimes, multiple enemies are confronted. But, other times, one enemy specifically is targeted by the Word of God. Determining what enemy is attacking a Christian will help you see what kind of Gospel needs to be applied within the sermon.

- If the enemy is Satan – you will likely hear about *Christus Victor* – Christ the victor – Christ has overcome Satan for you; Satan has no power over you: Satan’s victory’s are transient.
- If the enemy is the world – you will likely hear a Gospel of encouragement and hope. Again, *Christus Victor* – Christ has overcome the world.
- If the enemy is Sin (or the sinful flesh) – you will hear a lot of forgiveness language. The Law will be very pointed, and the Gospel of forgiveness will be applied generously.

Of course, these are broad and sometimes overlapping categories. So if you are searching for the Gospel (or aren’t hearing the Gospel in the sermon) – take a step back and ask yourself first, “What type of Law is being applied?” Perhaps then the Gospel will shine forth more clearly.

God bless you as you continue to hear His Word.

## **News and Notes of St. Peter**

### **The Love In the Name of Christ Diaper Ministry**

Discussions began in the fall of 2015 to encourage our church to take over the diaper ministry at Love INC. The Transition team, under the guidance of Pastor Tim Anderson, decided to accept the challenge to take over the project.

The council decided to devote \$2,363.33 of Lutheran Foundation funds for purchasing diapers. The money had to be spent by mid-December or returned to the Lutheran Foundation.

Owen’s Kroger accepted the challenge of ordering diapers for our church. Thanks to George Ditzler, George Juergens and George Eickhoff for delivering the pallets of diapers from Owen’s.

With the Lutheran Foundation funding and the inventory from Love INC, a classroom was transformed into a “store.”

Love INC asked us to take their inventory of baby food which we did. They continue to supply more baby food about twice a month.

Pam Wertenberger accepted the role of co-chairing the project. Janet Bennett, Peggy Hoch and Judy Turgeson also help us. Judy has added quilted items to our supply. Volunteers from other churches have packaged diapers. Two ladies make bags for newborns filled with blankets and onesies.

Judy Juergens has undertaken the job of collecting money from the diaper canisters placed around Huntington. Gil Shideler collects donations from Markle and Warren. These donations have totaled \$617.61 to date.

At present we have given 2,720 diapers to approximately 80 needy families. Each diaper pack has a package of wet wipes. Many are grateful for the baby food.

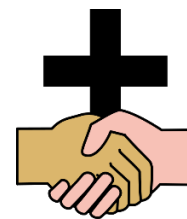

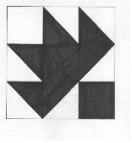
